The Mahamid Arabs had settled in Diffa from Chad in the 1970s to flee from<br>draught and in the 1980s following an armed conflict. Disputes with the Fulani<br>pastoralists included access to water points, land use, and animal grazing rights.<br>Tensions over resources have become more urgent given the emergence of Boko Haram<br>across the borders of Diffa, resulting in vast forced displacements of its neighbouring<br>populations from Libya, Mali and Nigeria into the region.
