Page 5, Annex I, Interim Reciprocal Information and Consultation System: Both parties agree to establish an Interim Reciprocal Information and Consultation System for movement of units of their Armed Forces in areas of the South West Atlantic. The aims of this system are to increase confidence between Argentina and the United Kingdom and to contribute to achieving a more normal situation in the region without unnecessary delay. The system consists of the following provisions:

I. Direct Communication Link

A. A direct communication link will be established between the respective military authorities –under the supervision of both Foreign Ministries — in order to:
