Article 1

On the Principles

- 1. In accordance with the objectives of the Transition, as listed in Chapter II of the Global and Inclusive Agreement on Transition in the Democratic Republic of Congo, a restructured and integrated national army shall be established;
- 2. This army shall be established based on the principles of the Global and Inclusive Agreement (paragraph 6 chapter III and chapter IV);
- 3. In accordance with paragraphs a and b of Chapter VI of the Agreement, a mechanism for the creation of a restructured and integrated national army shall be established. This shall consist of a meeting of Chiefs of Staff.
